## ***DIRECTIONS to Southern Naturally***

We are on the corner of Guise Rd. and Aparima Rd. Rapid No. 329 . The maps below shows us as a green flag, with a green 'road' being the easiest route from Invercargill taking 40 to 50 minutes



Several top quality roads lead to the club, each offering unique views of Southland.

# From Queenstown


Turn right (west) before Winton onto highway 96 'Nightcaps- Ohai'. If you pass the cemetery, you have gone too far.

There is another way via Mossburn near Lumsden, however Winton is the simplest way.

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\*1 Follow the Nightcaps road without deviation. After crossing the Aparima River at the gravel works, turn left.



At this sign, turn right, turning left at this hall



then finally, right onto Guise Road



The club grounds immediately on the right side through the trees where it is well signed with the standard blue **Rapid No. 329**



## *From Dunedin*

Travelling through Mataura, take the first right 'T' to Winton.. Right at Winton 'T' intersection, then passing the cemetery,



Left onto highway 96 'Nightcaps- Ohai'



## *From Invercargill Via Winton*

Just past Winton, Left onto highway 96 'Nightcaps- Ohai' then proceed as for \*1 above.

# From Invercargill Alternative 1

Lorville Roundabout turn left to State Highway 99

Look for the Riverton Tuatapere Road sign- 'Riverton Wallacetown Highway'

The road bends down hill slightly passing one of Southland's Alliance freezing works and an old factory, the original home of Highlander Condensed Milk, 1892 – 1964

You are now heading towards Wallace town, named after the infamous Scotsman 'Wallace' of bare bum fame!

After crossing the Oreti River, turn right into Argyle Otahuti Rd' towards the town of Wianawa



The road trundles along a few bends and dips but you won't get lost if you follow the obvious road.

From here you will see views of farmlands all the way out to Stewart Island. Arriving at the T intersection of 'Otautau Drummond Rd' turn left.



Travelling past an historic church landmark, sign posted 'calcium cemetery'



You take the turn to the right into 'Lindsay calcium Rd' by the Fairfax Primary School.



From this corner it is 16km drive to the blue berry farm where you can pick your own, when in season.

Trundle along again and soon you will cross the Aparima River Bridge into Otautau



Soon you will see this sign.>

\* Do not be led astray by road signs and map references to Aparima mentioned in conjunction with Riverton. Any and all references to Riverton being of Aparima is a political stunt and utterly incorrect information. DO NOT TURN LEFT!



The Aparima you want is north of Otautau; the photo above is the sign at this T intersection which is on the north side of Otautau; head north (right) towards Wreys Bush [blue sign]

At the large sweeping bend, GO STRAIGHT AHEAD!



After about 10 kms from Otautau, while on the Otautau-Wreys Bush Rd, turn left into Aparima Rd, a gravel road just 2.5 kms from our club.



Note: the sign says Aparima twice NOT Riverton!!

Take a left turn at Guise Rd. The main entry is immediately around the corner, on the right through the trees and off 'Guise Road' - Rapid number 329



## *From Invercargill Alternative 2*

Same as per #1 for the first part, but driving past the Argyle Otahuti Rd' (to Wianawa). Instead, continue to a right turn (north) at the T intersection, at the top of a rise, into Waiamtuku Flat road'.

This passes through dairy farms on a delightful small sealed country road. At a slow left turn this joins the 'Argyle Otahuti Rd' (as in alternative #1 )... continue on to a left into 'Faifax Isa Bank road and continue as per #1
